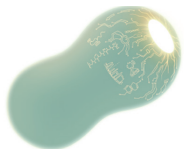

About the Congress

The triennial Congress of the International Sericultural Commission will provide a precious opportunity for scientists and students to share latest researches in the fields sericulture and silk including various silkworms, host plants, post-cocoon technology, silk processing, economy, and so on. The assembly of delegates from silk producing and consuming countries is also expected to be advantageous for those in silk-related business to promote mercantile economic relations.

Theme: "Silk beyond the Textile"

Sericulture and silk industry is expected to play important roles in new fields to produce various materials, such as pharmaceutical drugs, as well as in conventional fiber and textile production. The congress covers all aspects of sericulture and silk researches.

Official Language

English is the official language of the Congress.

Your Contributions

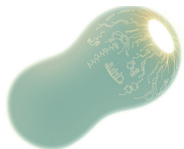
There will be both oral and poster presentations. Interested persons may please send their abstracts by e-mail to both the organizer (natuo-ISC2019@affrc.go.jp) and the chairperson of the corresponding section (details are given below). Abstracts should be given as a Microsoft Word file, typed with Times New Roman, 12 pt, in one page of A4 size with 30-mm margins. It will include a title, author names, affiliations, addresses and e-mail addresses. Last date for submission of abstracts is 18th September 2019.

Selection Process for Contributions

Chairpersons would select the contributions based on merit, contemporaneous issue selection, contextual appropriateness, equitable distributions to various themes of different sections, country-wise parity, and the time-slots available, etc. The chairpersons would also demarcate the contributions for oral or poster presentations.

Publication of Abstracts and Proceedings

The organizer reserves the right to edit and publish the abstracts of contributions received, and the proceedings of the Congress. The proceedings would include contributions selected for oral and poster presentations, as well as other select contributions. Select papers would be considered for publication in the scientific journal of ISC; *Sericologia*.



Oral Presentations

Each paper will be given 15 minutes for presentation and discussion (12 minutes for presentation and 3 minutes for discussion) while keynote paper will be given 30 minutes for presentation and discussion. A room for each section will be equipped with a LCD projector.

Poster Presentation

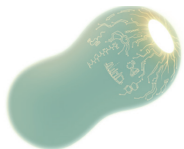
The poster display will be arranged at a meeting room. The poster presentation will be given 1.5 hours for presentation and discussion on Day 2 of the congress. Each poster will be allotted a display board 90 cm x 210 cm (width x height). All illustrations must be brought by the authors.

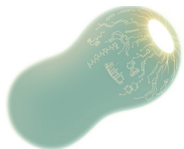

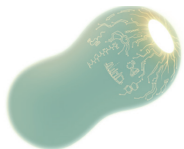
The Venue

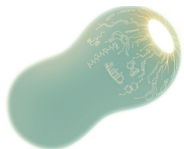

A model silk-reeling factory established by the Japanese government in 1872. Although it has stopped reeling, it shows us the history of modernization of Japan's industry. It was designated as a World Heritage by UNESCO in 2014.

Nippon Silk Center

A museum of sericulture and silk, showing history of sericulture and silk industries as well as science of the silkworm.

Immuno-Biological Laboratories Co. Ltd.

A company producing recombinant proteins by transgenic silkworms, which are reared in a factory.

Daruma-ji Temple

A Buddhist temple famous for round-shaped Daruma dolls, symbols of perseverance and good luck.

Day-trip for Accompanying Persons

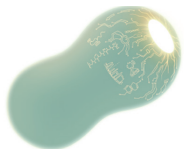
A day-trip around Tsukuba city will be arranged for accompanying persons on 20th November 2019 to visit tourist sites and a shopping mall.

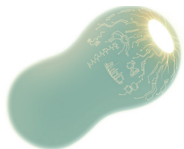
